2. What is logic?

"Logic deals with methods of valid thinking. It reveals how to draw proper conclusions from premises and is a prerequisite of all thought. In fact, it builds from fundamental laws of reality and truth, the principles, that make rational thought possible." - Baker Encyclopedia of Christian apologetics by Norman L. Geisler, p. 427

6. Examples of the use of logic from the word of God

- A. Apologetics- Acts 17: 1- 3, 10- 13. The Apostle Paul is reasoning in the synagogue of the Jews in the cities of Thessalonica and Berea, concerning the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead and Jesus being the Messiah.
- B. Polemics Acts 17: 16- 34. The Apostle Paul is preaching, arguing, proclaiming, in Greece to the Epicurean and Stoic philosophers, to Greek pagans the existence of the true God and resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.
- C. Apologetics and Polemics Mark 2: 1- 12.
 - Jesus Christ reasoned in their mind what's in their heart
 - Jesus Christ declares which is easier to say to the paralytic 'your sins are forgiven' or 'pick up your bed and walk'?
 - Jesus Christ did both
 - Jesus Christ forgives the paralytic of his sins
 - Scribes and Pharisees- only God can forgive sin Isaiah 43:25

- Jesus Christ reasoned in their mind blasphemy
- The Son of Man forgives and heals
- D. **Note:** Jesus Christ and the Apostle Paul used objective logic and logical truths. They did not just say simply believe. But both used logic found in the Word of God to convey Spiritual truths.

VI. The Three Fundamental Laws of All Rational Thought in Logic and Reasoning.

1. The Law of non-contradiction

A is not A and non A at the same time same place Example: Isaiah 5:20 evil is not good. Good is not evil.

2. The Law of Identity

(A is A) Example: 1 John 2:22

3. The law of excluded middle

(Either A or non A)

Either a statement is true or false. There is no middle ground.

Example: John 14: 6. No other way

VIII. Common Logical Fallacies Made By Muslims





"Be diligent to present yourself approved to God a worker who doesn't need to be ashamed correctly teaching the word of truth.

2 Timothy 2: 15

"For although we are walking in the flesh, we do not wage war in a fleshly way, since the weapons of our war are not fleshly, but are powerful through God for the demolition of strongholds. We demolish arguments [false logic] in every high minded thing that is raised up against the knowledge of God, taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ."

Note:

The majority of Muslims are not aware they are committing these logical fallacies which are an error in logic and theology. That's why it is important for us to listen, discern, reason and point out the Muslim's errors in thinking and establish the eternal truths from God's word. Replacing their false presupposition with the eternal truths from the word of God

IX. Facing the Muslim Challenge: Common Logical Fallacies Made By Muslims

Fallacy	Source
A. Numerical Fallacy (Argumentum ad populum (Bandwagon Fallacy)	1.9 billion Muslims in the world. We are the fastest growing religion in the world!

Answer:

- Numbers do not determine a truth claim
- Biological growth rate, Muslim have average family of four to six children
- Also story of Noah and the ark

- Use of Arabic words repeatedly cited to bolster one's arguments
- However, argument is never addressed
- No evidence presented

Fallacy	Source
O. The Fallacy of False Assumption	 Historical precedent Burden of proof rest on those who present new theories not on those who whose ideas have already been verified The Old test the New Already established authority judges any new claims to authority

- Islam has burden of proof and not Christianity
- The Bible tests and judges the Quran
- Quran contradicts the Bible
- The Bible must logically be given first place as order of authority
- The Quran is in error until it proves itself

Fallacy	Source
P. Fallacy of Irrelevance	 When one introduces issues which have no logical bearing on the subject under discussion. One is using irrelevant arguments. Deflecting

- 1. Topic under discussion is salvation and eternal life
- 2. The Muslim deflects
- 3. Doesn't answer the question and introduces a different topic such as the perfect presentation of the Quran and the eloquence of how it sounds being read in Arabic
- 4. Salvation is the issue; has nothing to do with that. Preservation of Quran

Fallacy	Source
Q. The Strawman Fallacy	 Placing a false argument into the mouth of your opponent, then refuting it by knocking it down. Distorting and misrepresenting an opponent's beliefs in order to make it easier to defeat instead of debating the actual argument

- Balboa Park . . . 'you believe in three gods'.
- Jesus Christ and the fig tree
- Hungry all he had to do as God, say Be and make fruit
- Pomona mosque

R. Causal Fallacy (False Cause Fallacy)	 This is a category of informal fallacies in which a cause is incorrectly identified as being the reason for an event.
	 The two events may coincide - but no causal connection.

- At the mosque, Muslim declared we do not need the Bible. Jesus is the Quran
- We believe in Jesus too

- The jesus of the Quran is not the historical Jesus of the Bible
- It is another Jesus 2 Corinthians 11:3-4
- The Jesus of the Bible is God the Son who died on a cross and resurrected
- The Quran and Muslims deny all the historical facts concerning Jesus Christ
- Surah 5:116
- Surah 4:157-158
- There is no parallel between the Jesus of the Bible and the false jesus of Islam

- Dr. Jeff Kran: "If a 4'.2" witness comes into court, his size has nothing to do with the reliability of his testimony in a court of law. Especially when other witnesses come later to verify reliability of the earlier witness.
- John Ryland manuscript 120 AD
- 27,000 manuscripts for New Testament reliability

Fallacy	Source
W. Red herring fallacy	 A red herring is something that misleads or distracts from relevant or important questions posed to someone. The difficult questions is not answered or addressed. Instead of answering the questions, the person turns around and attacks an unrelated issue to deflect attention and avoid answering the direct questions posed to them.

Example:

At the Mosque. I brought up the numerous sins of Muhammad. The Muslim sidesteps the issue, avoids answering my evidence and brings something up that is unrelated. "Where did Jesus say I am God"?

X. Conclusion

1. Only a true ideology can step an evil ideology

- 2. only a true ideology can expose an evil ideology

Witnessing To Muslims

- 1. **Be their friend.** As is true in witnessing to others, Muslims do not care about how much you know until they know how much you care.
- 2. **Be humble.** Don't have a spiritual chip on your shoulder and speak down to the Muslim. You will build an unnecessary barrier if you approach the Muslim with an implied superiority.
- 3. **Be patient.** Sometimes this means explaining the same thing ten times if you need to.
- 4. Be prayerful. Pray especially that the Muslim will see the futility of trying to live good enough to earn God's favor. Even the smallest failure brings condemnation. (James 2:10). By contrast, talk about the wonderful grace of God and how God has offered salvation as a free gift for those who believe in Jesus Christ (Ephesians 2:8-9).
- 5. **Don't create unnecessary barriers** by saying disdainful things about Muhammad and the Quran. Focus instead on the good things about Jesus, what He did at the cross and the Bible.
- 6. **Don't hesitate to quote from the Bible**. If they argue that the Bible has been corrupted, be ready to demonstrate why you trust the Bible's accuracy.

- 7. **Mention the Quran.** The Quran enjoins every true Muslim to believe in and honor all the prophets of God. Therefore, urge the Muslim to consider the truth-claims of Jesus Christ.
- 8. **Emphasize Submission.** "Islam" means "submission." Emphasize that Jesus submitted in going to the cross for the sins of mankind, making possible a free gift of salvation for those who believe in Him. (Hebrews 5:7-10)
- 9. **Emphasize Jesus.** Respectfully mention the Quran's affirmation that Jesus was sinless and all-righteous (Surahs 3:45, 49; 4:158), whereas Muhammad was exhorted in the Quran to seek forgiveness for his faults (Surahs 16:61; 40:55; 42:4, 30; 47:19; 48:1-20). Use that as a launch-pad to share the uniqueness of christ's atoning work on the cross (2 Corinthians 5:19-21).
